As we bid farewell to another transformative year, the Georgia Council on Economic Education takes immense pride in reflecting upon the accomplishments and strides made in fulfilling our mission of helping K-12 teachers teach economics and personal finance. 2023 was a testament to our unwavering dedication to educators and their students and the continued support of our stakeholders, volunteers, and partners.



Recognizing the pivotal role of educators, GCEE conducted a record number of effective professional development workshops for 3,721 teachers in 143 of Georgia's 181 public school systems. GCEE also continued its commitment to providing access to quality education to underserved communities through our "Rural Georgia" initiative. The GCEE program team reached a record number of teachers and students in underserved areas of the state – logging more than 14,500 miles in the process.

As we set our sights on the future, GCEE remains committed to furthering our impact. In 2024, we aim to:

- Expand our reach into a greater number of public school systems in Georgia.

We are also planning special workshops in amazing places such as the <u>Booth Western Art</u> <u>Museum</u> in Cartersville and the <u>Museum of Aviation</u> in Warner Robins.

FALL 2023 STOCK MARKET GAME WINNERS

STUDENT COMPETITIONS

Historic Repeat Win in the Stock Market Game

Competing against thousands of teams to win the Georgia Stock Market Game is a fantastic feat. To do so twice is genuinely remarkable. But that is what one outstanding student did in 2023. In the fall season of the Stock Market Game, Jimmy Slack from Woodville-Tompkins High School competed against 3,532 teams across the state to win the big prize. Slack began the season with \$100,000, and in just ten short weeks, he turned that into \$202,455.19 in equity.



This is Jimmy Slack's second time winning the overall state competition of the

Stock Market Game. Slack and teammate Jimena M. won the Spring 2023 competition with \$248,495 in equity. Becoming a two-time winner is highly unusual - a first in recent Georgia Stock Market Game history.

Slack attends Woodville-Tompkins Technical and Career High School in Savannah and is taught by former GCEE Economics Teacher of the Year John Cook. Jimmy's top investment in the game was in CAUD, with a gain of 86%. His prizes included a \$500 Amazon gift card, a trophy, and a banner. Slack and John Cook will be recognized at the annual Stock Market Game Awards Luncheon at the Fox Theatre on May 9th.

Special category winners in the fall Stock Market Game also received prizes, including \$400 Amazon gift cards. Rural Division winners were a two-student team from Thomas County Middle in Thomasville, GA, taught by teacher Stacie Layne. The winner of the Teacher Competition was John Masley of Ridgeland High School in Walker County. A team of students taught by Rayleen Tajirian at

John Robert Lewis Elementary School in Bibb County won the New Teacher Division, finishing the game as top dogs amongst hundreds of teams coached by teachers brand new to the Stock Market Game.
